A Godly Mindset

"God gives wisdom, knowledge and happiness." Ecclesiastes 2:26

I recently ran across an interesting article from Crisis Magazine, a Catholic publication. It stated that due to the pervasive and instantaneous nature of world news today, people are more likely than ever to get depressed, angry and frustrated since there's nothing anyone can do about the relentless flow of bad news. So, instead of giving in to anger over what we can't control, adopt a peasant's mindset. Peasants knew little beyond what was happening in their own little community. They focused on the here and now, on things they could do something about. Their priorities were the harvest, repairing the church roof, planning for the next church or community event. Like them we could ignore what is happening in Washington or Ukraine and dedicate our focus on our own lives and relationships.

No doubt, it is easy to become fixated on news and politics and solving the world's problems. But perhaps there's a better way to fight against it than adopting a peasant's mindset. How about focusing on something else, on something that's always wholesome, on something that can actually put things into a proper and godly perspective that provides us with hope, optimism and joy?

Long ago Solomon wrote, "I have seen the burden God has laid on the human race. He has made everything beautiful in its time. He has also set eternity in the human heart; yet no one can fathom what God has done from beginning to end ... I know that everything God does will endure forever; nothing can be added to it and nothing taken from it." (Ecclesiastes 3:11,14).

God's Word teaches that no one and nothing can take away what God decides to give. For example, consider that God has given us the greatest gift of all, his love and forgiveness in Christ, and there's no one and nothing that can separate God's children from his love (Romans 8:35). Nor is there anything a person can add to God's plan of salvation. It's complete, every bit of it furnished by God himself for us so that what we have from him is perfect, "the gift of God—not by works, so that no one can boast" (Ephesians 2:8,9).

Worry about current events or possible future catastrophes erodes away the joy God wants us to have and actually gives to us in Christ. Worry distracts from what is greater, from something so powerful that it erases away every fear—from God's love, which "endures forever" (Psalm 136), from God's Word which "endures forever" (Isaiah 40:8), and from Jesus Christ himself, who "is the same yesterday and today and forever (Hebrews 13:8). Spend more time in God's Word, and less time on the news. You'll not only see things in a more proper perspective, but you'll also find yourself happier and with a much stronger faith too.

## From Your Parish Nurses... Insect Bites

Most insect bites and stings are mild and can be treated at home. They might cause itching, swelling, and stinging that go away in a day or two. Some bites or stings can transmit disease-causing bacteria, viruses, or parasites. Sometimes stings from bees, yellow jackets, wasps, hornets, and fire ants might cause a severe allergic reaction (anaphylaxis).

Suggested ways to treat a mild reaction to an insect bite or sting:

- Remove any stingers.
- Gently wash the area with soap and water.
- Apply a cloth dampened with cold water or filled with ice to the area of the bite or sting for 10-20 minutes. If a bite is on an arm or leg, elevate it to help reduce pain and swelling.
- Apply to the affected area calamine lotion, baking soda paste, or 0.5% or 1% hydrocortisone cream. Do this several times a day until your symptoms go away.
- Take an oral anti-itch medicine (antihistamine) to reduce itching (such as non-prescription cetirizine, fexofenadine, loratadine, and pain reliever).

Seek medical care if the swelling gets worse, the site shows signs of infection, or you don't feel well.

Call 911 or your local medical emergency number if stung by a scorpion or having a serious reaction that suggests anaphylaxis, even if it's just one or two signs or symptoms:

- Trouble breathing
- Swelling of the lips, face, eyelids or throat
- Dizziness, fainting, or unconsciousness
- A weak and rapid pulse
- Hives
- Nausea, vomiting, or diarrhea
