### The Secret to Contentment and Thankfulness

Fall is moving along quickly, and November has arrived. Naturally, that means Thanksgiving is coming soon. What things about Thanksgiving do you look forward to? Is it spending time with family? Maybe it's enjoying an afternoon of watching football or relaxing from a day off work? Are you looking forward to a table full of turkey, stuffing, mashed potatoes, cranberries, and of course pumpkin pie? A meal where no one ever goes away hungry, and we usually find ourselves eating too much. Whether it's spending time with family, enjoying a delicious meal, or spending the day watching football it's easy for us to find contentment on Thanksgiving.

Does it ever seem like that feeling of contentment is hard to maintain in our lives? Often, we can be tempted to focus on what we don't have. We may find ourselves wishing that we had more of this or that. Thinking it would be nice if I just had some more peace, money, rest, vacation days, or earthly possessions. And with that maybe comes the temptation to take what God has given us for granted.

God's Word gives us the key to finding contentment. The Apostle Paul tells us, "For I have learned to be content whatever the circumstances. I know what is it to be in need, and I know what it is to have plenty. I have learned the secret of being content in any and every situation, whether well fed or hungry, whether living in plenty or in want" (*Philippians 4:11-12*).

During his life, Paul experienced both highs and lows. He went through times when he had plenty and life was going well. On the other hand, he also experienced hardships and challenges. There were times when he suffered persecution, imprisonment, attacks, and was lacking things that we would call necessities. However, despite these dire circumstances, Paul was still satisfied because he had found the secret of contentment.

The Apostle Paul was content because he knew that God has already provided him with what he needed most. He understood that in Christ, God has provided for his spiritual and eternal needs. Jesus Christ has rescued us from sin, death, and the devil. Through his death and resurrection, he has provided us with forgiveness and eternal life. Understanding that, we know that our gracious God will continue to provide for our daily needs.

This contentment that comes from faith now leads to thankfulness. We see all that God has done and want to thank the One who generously opens his hand and blesses us. Each day we have a reason to give thanks because we are God's dearly loved children. We live in appreciation of what our Savior has done for us. And it is the gospel of Jesus Christ which gives us grateful hearts as we seek to serve our Lord, who has served us first. As the Apostle Paul encourages us, "give thanks in all circumstances for this is God's will for you in Christ Jesus."

# From Your Parish Nurses: Subconjunctival Hemorrhage

A subconjunctival hemorrhage is the bursting of a tiny blood vessel in the protective tissue covering the eye. A subconjunctival hemorrhage can be thought of like a bruise, when a blood vessel breaks in skin tissue. When a blood vessel in the conjunctiva (thin protective layer that covers the eye) bursts, the blood isn't absorbed right away. Instead, it leaks between the conjunctiva and the white of the eye.

Minor trauma may cause a subconjunctival hemorrhage. But even a strong sneeze or cough can cause a blood vessel in the conjunctiva to burst. A subconjunctival hemorrhage may look alarming, but it's usually a harmless condition that doesn't need treatment. It typically disappears within a few days to a few weeks.

The main sign of a subconjunctival hemorrhage is a bright red patch on the white part of the eye. A subconjunctival hemorrhage looks worse than it actually is. It should cause no discharge, pain or change in vision. The only discomfort may be itching or irritation. If you have subconjunctival hemorrhages often or other easy bruising or bleeding, talk with your healthcare professional.

Also, see your health professional (PCP or eye care provider) if you injure your eye, have eye pain, or have vision changes.
