One Solitary Life

The following words, written by an unknown person have become well known to many people. These words remind us that, by purely human standards, Jesus Christ of Nazareth was very 'ordinary" in many respects. Yet the impact of his life and work surpasses that of any other person in history. And why is that? Because Jesus is the true God as well as a true man, at one and the same time. He is the one and only Savior from sin for all people, and he is Lord over all people and all things. Please read the words that follow. May they heighten your appreciation for Jesus and spur you on to know him and his written Word. Use the extra worship opportunities this Lenten season, Holy Week, and Easter Sunday to strengthen your faith and draw you closer to the "One Solitary Life" of your Lord and Risen Savior.

He was born in an obscure village, the child of a peasant woman. He grew up in still another village, where he worked in a carpenter shop until he was thirty. Then, for three years he was an itinerant preacher.

He never wrote a book. He never held an office. He never had a family or owned a house. He didn't go to college.

He never traveled 200 miles from the place where he was born. He did none of the things that one usually associates with greatness.

He had no credentials but himself.

He was only 33 when public opinion turned against him. His friends ran away. He was turned over to his enemies and went through the mockery of a trial. He was nailed to a cross between two thieves. When he was dying, his executioners gambled for his clothing, the only property he had on earth. When he was dead, he was laid in a borrowed grave through the pity of a friend.

Nineteen centuries have come and gone, and today he is the central figure of the human race, the leader of humankind's progress.

All the armies that ever marched, all the navies that ever sailed, all the parliaments that ever sat, all the kings that ever reigned, put together, have not affected the life of people on earth as that "One Solitary Life."

From Your Parish Nurses... What Is Dementia?

Dementia is a term that describes the loss of memory and cognitive functioning that gradually interferes with a person's daily living activities. Alzheimer's disease is the most common type of dementia.

Dementia moves through stages, from mild to severe. Those with mild dementia symptoms may show only a loss of memory. As dementia progresses, severe symptoms develop, such as confusion, extreme loss of memory, and the failure to recognize people familiar to them.

Typical Age-Related Changes:

- Making a bad decision once in a while
- Missing a monthly payment
- Forgetting what day it is and remembering it later
- Sometimes forgetting which word to use
- Losing things from time to time

Signs of Alzheimer's and Dementia:

- Poor judgment and decision-making
- Inability to manage a budget
- Losing track of the date or the season
- Difficulty having a conversation
- Misplacing things and being unable to retrace the steps to find them

If you notice any of the warning signs of Alzheimer's or dementia in yourself or someone you know, don't ignore them. Schedule an appointment with your doctor. With early detection, you can explore treatments that may provide some relief of symptoms and help you or your loved one maintain a level of independence longer.

Every time we eat the bread (Christ's body) and wine (Christ's blood) of Holy Communion, we are given the true food for forgiveness! What joy is ours!

What about you? Is the guilt of your sin weighing you down? Perhaps you haven't been in church for sometime. No matter. Come, your food is ready. Eat and be forgiven.
