## **Joy Amidst Quaking and Fear**

Several years ago, on a mission trip to India, I was in a taxi in Delhi. Suddenly, unexpectedly, there was an earthquake, buildings were swaying, people poured out into the streets from every direction. My driver did his best to maneuver down the congested downtown avenue towards our destination. The quake only lasted a minute or so, but the people remained in the streets, terrified, waiting for the typical aftershock. Thanks be to God, there was minimal damage that day there in the heart of Delhi, but a few hundred miles away thousands of people lost their lives. Like the recent earthquakes in Turkey and Syria, what a horrific experience!

Mary Magdalene and the other Mary who walked to the tomb went there expecting death. They were already traumatized by the terror of seeing their beloved Jesus beaten and executed. Then the earth began to quake, and they were afraid all over again.

Instead of broken glass, they saw blinding light and an angel, who shone with painful brightness. Do not be afraid the angel said, he has been raised. The women were still filled with terror but something else crept in—great joy. They ran to tell the disciples and met the risen Lord on the way.

The Easter story is one of interwoven fear and joy—the same is true in our lives. We don't have to live on a fault line to feel the ground move beneath our feet. We have all felt the earthquake, so to speak. It's the phone call that begins with, "sit down." It is the doctor with bad news from the PET scan. It is the realization that you can't fix the relationship. It is the realization that you can't fix your child. It is another month when the money runs out before the month does. We have all lived through some kind of earth-quaking experience. We have all felt fear.

Yet sometimes it is precisely in the shaking that we get a glimpse of great joy. Someone you love is holding your hand. A member of church brings a hot meal. A scripture verse brings a word of comfort. God's peace comes unexpectedly. Someone offers you forgiveness. Someone sits quietly beside you.

The women at the tomb did not suddenly drop their fears when they learned that Jesus was alive. The women ran to tell the good news while they were full of fear and joy. The same may be true for us. They were afraid, but they went anyway. They did not go alone—they had each other—and as they went, they found Jesus. I can think of worse metaphors for the life of a disciple.

"No storm can shake my inmost calm" read the words of the hymn "My Life Flows on in Endless Song." This is not entirely true when I am relying on a calm I must manufacture. I cannot manufacture it. But God can. Our inner calm is God's own peace, given by the Spirit.

What I know from Christ's death and resurrection is that God does not promise a life of steady ground. God promises God's presence in the shaking and joy of God's loving embrace.

God says to us what Jesus said to those fearful and joyful women at the tomb: you will see me. It is the most solid foundation on which to rest.

*The angel said to the women, "Do not be afraid, for I know that you are looking for Jesus, who was crucified. He is not here; he has risen, just as he said. Come and see the place where he lay. Then go quickly and tell his disciples: 'He has risen from the dead and is going ahead of you into Galilee. There you will see him.' Now I have told you." (Matthew 28:5-7)*

## From Your Parish Nurses... Thyroid Disease

The thyroid gland is a butterfly-shaped endocrine gland that is normally located in the lower front of the neck. The thyroid's job is to make thyroid hormones, which are secreted into the blood and then carried to every tissue in the body. Thyroid hormone helps the body use energy, stay warm, and keep the brain, heart, muscles, and other organs working as they should. The two most common issues with the thyroid are as follows:

**Hypothyroidism** is an underactive thyroid gland. Hypothyroidism means that the thyroid gland can't make enough thyroid hormone to keep the body running normally. The deficiency of thyroid hormones can disrupt such things as heart rate, body temperature, and all aspects of metabolism. Hypothyroidism is most prevalent in older women. Common causes are autoimmune disease, surgical removal of the thyroid, and radiation treatment. Major symptoms include fatigue, cold sensitivity, constipation, dry skin, and unexplained weight gain. Treatment consists of thyroid hormone replacement with medication. Because the symptoms are so variable and nonspecific, the only way to know for sure whether you have hypothyroidism is with a simple blood test for TSH. Because thyroid disease runs in families, you should explain your hypothyroidism to your relatives and encourage them to get periodic TSH tests.

**Hyperthyroidism** refers to any condition in which there is too much thyroid hormone produced by the thyroid gland. Too much thyroid hormone speeds up most functions of the body. Symptoms include anxiousness, nervousness, decreased ability to concentrate (attention-deficit like symptoms), decreased school or work performance, moodiness and irritability, always feeling warm, heart racing (palpitations), tremors (shaky hands), frequent bowel movements, and weight loss despite a good, or even increased, appetite. Difficulty sleeping, tiredness, decreased strength, and decreased ability to tolerate exercise are also common. Even going up and down stairs may be more tiring than usual. Younger children may show increased growth (increased height), however, the onset of puberty may be delayed until treatment is started. The most common cause of hyperthyroidism in children and adolescents is a condition named after the physician who first described it, Graves' disease. In the majority of cases, treatment is needed to reduce the amount of thyroid hormone being produced. The goal of treatment is to normalize the thyroid hormone levels and to make the signs and symptoms go away.

If you suspect that you or a loved one have hyperthyroidism, diagnosis is usually a simple matter. A physical examination usually detects an enlarged thyroid gland and a rapid pulse. The physician will also look for moist, smooth skin and a tremor of your fingers. Your reflexes are likely to be fast, and your eyes may have some abnormalities if you have Graves' disease. The diagnosis of hyperthyroidism will be confirmed by laboratory tests that measure the amount of thyroid hormones
