Come to Jesus This Lent!

*"Come to me, all you who labor and are heavy laden, and I will give you rest."
— Matthew 11:28*

*Making your way
in the world today
takes everything you've got.*

*Taking a break
from all your worries
sure would help a lot.*

*Wouldn't you like
to get away?*

*Sometimes you want to go
where everybody

The words above are recognizable to many as the lyrics to the theme song of the popular TV show, “Cheers.” The lyricist certainly succeeded in giving poetic voice to some of our most commonly felt needs: the need to retreat from a world that is frequently hostile, the need to unburden ourselves of our worries, the need to be with people who live under similar circumstances and know us by name.

The question, though, is whether the relief suggested by the song really works. “Cheers,” you see, is a Boston bar. So what the song really suggests is that the cure for many of life's problems is stopping at a tavern after work.

While there may be a spirit of comradery in the taproom, as well as a chance to forget one's troubles, there are also very likely to be problems if a person continually seeks solace at a bar, not the least of which may be alcohol dependency.

I'd like to suggest that the words to the “Cheers” theme song might more appropriately invite people into a Christian church. In church, where Jesus comes to us in his Word, the relief is real, not chemically induced. Admittedly, life is full of unpleasantness, but listen to the Savior's cure for some of the problems expressed in the song:

Regarding our need to get out from under our worries, the Bible says, "Cast all your care upon Him, for he cares for you" (1 Peter 5:7).

Regarding our need to have friends who know us by name, Jesus referred to himself as the Good Shepherd and said he "calls his own sheep by name and leads them" (John 10:10).

In a sense “our troubles are all the same.” We all have sins which put us at odds with our sinless God. In love, though, God arranged to relieve us of that greatest of all troubles. He sent Jesus to live a sinless life for us, to pay for our sins at the cross. By faith in him we have the lasting rest that can't be found at the bottom of a cocktail glass or a bottle of beer. Jesus said it this way: “In the world you will have tribulation; but be of good cheer, I have overcome the world” (John 16:33b).

ELDER'S MESSAGE

"The words of the Lord are flawless, like silver purified in a crucible, like gold refined seven times." Psalms 12:6

From Your Parish Nurses... Diaper Rash in Infants

Diaper rash is any rash that affects your baby's diaper area. It is usually most common in young infants.

Diaper rash affects the buttocks, genitals, or thighs. It is very slightly reddened to a rash that can cause sores or blisters.

Causes can be too much moisture, chafing, or soiled diapers for extended periods of time.

Treatment includes keeping the area clean and dry. Change diapers frequently. Gently using soap and water is the best way. You can use disposable wipes, but don't rub the area. You can use home remedies, but be careful what you put on the skin. Use store-bought rash creams to rid of diaper rash. Ask your pediatrician if diaper rash becomes more severe.

Prevention:

- Change diapers as soon as possible
- Expose baby's bottom to fresh air by leaving diaper off
- Use mild detergent your baby's clothes and linens
- Observe any changes to skin when introducing foods
