From Your Parish Nurses...

The Warning Signs of a Stroke

The stroke treatments that work best are available only if the stroke is recognized and diagnosed within 3 hours of the first symptoms. Stroke patients may not be eligible for these if they don't arrive at the hospital in time.

If you think someone may be having a stroke, act F.A.S.T. and do the following test:

F—Face: Ask the person to smile. Does one side of the face droop?

A—Arms: Ask the person to raise both arms. Does one arm drift downward? Is there numbness or weakness, especially on just one side of the body?

S—Speech: Ask the person to repeat a simple phrase. Is the speech slurred or strange? Is the person confused?

T—Time: If you see any of these signs, call 9-1-1 right away.

Note the time when any symptoms first appear. This information helps health care providers determine the best treatment for each person. Do not drive to the hospital or let someone else drive you. Call 911 for an ambulance so that medical personnel can begin life-saving treatment on the way to the emergency room.

ELDER'S MESSAGE

Picture this. Everything is falling into place in your life. You got a new job or a promotion at work. You and your spouse are celebrating a big anniversary and you are happier than the day you got married. Maybe your kids are actually listening to you. What are your thoughts? Maybe you feel you have worked hard and therefore you deserve these things. Possibly you have been living a good Christian life and you therefore assume God is rewarding you for being a good person. At this time, do you give thanks to God for the gifts you have received? You should.

Now let's flip everything around. What if everything is falling apart in your life? You lose your job. Times are tough in your relationships with your spouse and kids. Maybe a close relative or friend has died unexpectedly. Are you now inclined to turn your back on God? Maybe you start to question your faith.

I'm guessing that most people can relate to both of these examples. How easy it is to give thanks when things are going good and how quickly we might turn from our faith when things are not going our way. However, in I Thessalonians 5:16-18, we are reminded to "Rejoice always, pray continually, give thanks in all circumstances; for this is God's will for you in Christ Jesus."

I certainly understand it is difficult to give thanks to God when things are going badly. The reality is, we as humans are not promised a perfect life on earth. There will be times of struggle and hardship we need to endure. Because of these difficult times, it is especially important that we come to God in prayer and thanksgiving in remembrance of the huge sacrifice Jesus Christ made for all of us. It is through Jesus' death on the cross that we have been given the ultimate gift.

In John 3:16, possibly the most well-known Bible verse, John writes: "For God so loved the world, that he gave his only Son, that whoever believes in him shall not perish but have eternal life."

It is this promise that we must focus on always. Our time on this earth is a fleeting moment, but our time with our Heavenly Father will last an eternity.
