**The Defining Moment**

There are some people who are already dreading the new year. One person said, "The holidays aren't over, and already I'm about 90 days ahead on my calories and 90 days behind on my bills." Perhaps some of you can identify with him.

The calendar did not come down from heaven, it was established by human beings. There is no real reason why one day on the calendar should be more significant than any other day of the year. But we still invest the changing of the year with a great deal of meaning. It's a time of hope, planning, and dreams of the future. It's also a time for resolutions, when many attempt to set themselves on a course of self-improvement.

One pastor came up with a list of resolutions that he called the "7 Ups for the New Year."

1. **WAKE UP** — Begin each day with the Lord, it's his day after all. Rejoice in it.
2. **DRESS UP** — Put on a smile. It will improve your looks and say something to others about your attitude.
3. **SHUT UP** — Watch your tongue. Don't gossip. Say nice things. Use your ears more and listen.
4. **STAND UP** — Take a stand for what God's Word teaches. Resist evil. Do good.
5. **LOOK UP** — Open your eyes to your Lord Jesus since he is, after all, your only Savior.
6. **REACH UP** — Spend time praising God in private and in public. Pray to him, confess your sins, thank him, and go to him for all your needs.
7. **LIFT UP** — Make yourself available to help those in need. Serve the Lord in your church, support the work of his ministry, and share the good news of Christ with everyone.

We don't often really consider how valuable the time is that God gives us. To realize the value of one month, ask a mother who gave birth to a premature baby. For the value of one week, ask the editor of a weekly newspaper. For the value of one hour, ask two people in love who are waiting to meet. For one minute, ask someone who just missed his bus. For one second, ask the person who just avoided an accident. For one millisecond, ask the person who won the silver medal in the Olympics.

Simeon was a righteous man, waiting for the Messiah to come. He was probably an old man, but he was zealous for his God. While many older people face the future with anxiety, fearing failing health, shrinking finances, social isolation, and hopeless years of meaninglessness, Simeon lived for one thing—and he was passionate about it. He wanted to greet the Messiah when he came. He saw only that one thing, cared for that one thing, lived for that one thing. He was content to live that way.

Wouldn't you know, God answered his prayer. One day at the temple it so happened that Mary and Joseph were there with Mary's infant son in her arms.

We know for certainty that we too will see Jesus with our very eyes. Are you living your life for that day? If you are, you can be as satisfied with your life as Simeon was with his, and like him, your heart will be filled with true and eternal joy.

### 2023 Altar Flower Calendar

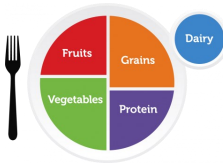

## From Your Parish Nurses... Healthy Eating for a Healthy Weight



When January comes around many people want to lose weight. There are all kinds of diets, programs, medications, etc. out there, but let's focus on healthy eating, which we should do all year round. The CDC's "My Plate" is an eating plan that helps manage weight and includes a healthy variety of foods. Add an array of colors to your plate and think of it as "eating the rainbow."

### The Dietary Guidelines for Americans (2020-2025):

- Emphasizes fruits, vegetables, whole grains, and fat-free or low-fat and milk products.
- Includes a variety of protein foods such as seafood, lean meats and poultry, eggs, legumes, soy products, nuts and seeds.
- Includes products low in added sugars, sodium, saturated fats, trans fat, and cholesterol. Avoid processed foods.
- Stay within your daily calorie needs.

### Fruits

- Fresh, frozen, or canned (avoid canned with high sugar syrups)

### Vegetables

- Add variety to grilled or steamed vegetables by using different herbs
- Try a new vegetable each week

### Calcium-Rich Foods

- Low fat and fat free yogurts without added sugars

### Meats / Proteins

- Instead of frying or breading meats, try grilling or baking
- Substitute dried beans instead of meat
- Ask a friend or search the internet for recipes with fewer calories

### Comfort Foods

- Eat them less often
- Eat smaller amounts
- Try a lower calorie version
