### **Abortion: A Religious Issue?**

One of the burning issues of our time is the abortion question. A continuing battle rages between those who favor abortion and those who oppose it. This has been reinforced by the recent overturn of Roe vs. Wade by our United States Supreme Court. It seems improbable that either side will convince the other of the validity of its position. It is simply a question of which side will prevail.

To those who put their faith in the Holy Scriptures as the inspired Word of God abortion is murder, prohibited by the Fifth Commandment. There is abundant Scriptural evidence to lead to this conviction: Not all people accept the Scriptures as the Word of God, however. Hence, there are bound to be irreconcilable differences with regard to various issues between those who believe and those who do not believe.

Now come proponents of abortion who contend that abortion is purely a religious issue and that those who oppose abortion have no right to inflict their religious views and practices on others against their will. We agree that we have no right to impose our religious beliefs on others by force of law. But we cannot agree that the matter of abortion is strictly a religious issue.

Few, if any people, including nonbelievers, would contend that society could function without laws pertaining to the protection of human life and property. There are fundamental standards of right and wrong in the relationships of human beings with one another without regard to religion. Robbery and murder are crimes, without reference to the religious beliefs of those who perpetrate these crimes or who suffer as their victims. These are not religious issues.

The unborn child is a living being, helpless though it may be — and for that reason all the more in need of protection. In the normal course of events it will achieve maturity, just as a child moves on through childhood to maturity as an adult. It makes no difference at what stage of development a life is taken. It is the taking of a life just the same. And since when is the taking of life purely a religious issue?

For you created my inmost being;

you knit me together in my mother's womb.

I praise you because I am fearfully and wonderfully made;

your works are wonderful,

I know that full well.

My frame was not hidden from you

when I was made in the secret place,

when I was woven together in the depths of the earth.

Your eyes saw my unformed body;

all the days ordained for me were written in your book

before one of them came to be. (Psalm 139: 13-16)

These passages do not apply only to the disciples but to us as well. The Lord wants us to share the good news of his saving gospel with others: friends, neighbors, fellow workers, relatives, strangers, and visitors to our church.

# THE IMPORTANCE OF SUNDAY SCHOOL

When John the Baptist was born, those who attended the celebration of his birth and circumcision asked, "What then is this child going to be?" (Luke 1:66). That is a question every



parent asks of his or her own child. Is my child going to be a doctor, lawyer, computer programmer, pastor or teacher? Is my child going to be successful, famous, wealthy?

These are important questions to consider. Because of questions like these, parents make difficult choices for their children, especially when it comes to education. We all want our children to get a good education so they can be properly equipped and prepared to successfully meet the challenges life will throw at them.

But the more important issue is—are our children properly prepared for the Kingdom of God?

When you think about it, Sunday School is the nursery of our church. For the Church to continue to exist and grow, it needs to train and care for the spiritual needs of its children.

Children need to know that God is the creator of all things. They need to know that all people are born sinners, condemned to eternal death. They need to know that Jesus Christ is the Son of God who has taken away their sins as well as the sins of the world. They need to know the stories of the Bible and the biographies of the saints put into writing by God himself, so they will have the complete knowledge of the history of God's plan of salvation. It is, after all, to our generation and the next that Christ has given the responsibility to pass along his gospel message.

Give your children the knowledge God wants them to have—the complete knowledge of their Savior Jesus Christ. Give them the spiritual tools they will receive in Sunday School so they will grow in their faith. Then they will be thoroughly prepared for the real challenges of life, the challenges caused by sin and the old evil foe—the devil. Equip your children that they may be the blessing God intends them to be for his Kingdom.

# From Your Parish Nurses... Screen Time and Children

With screens virtually everywhere, monitoring a child's screen time can be challenging. To complicate matters, some screen time can be educational and support children's social development. So how do you manage your child's screen time? Here's a primer on guiding your child's use of screens and media per the Mayo Clinic's Website.

#### The problems with screens

Too much screen time and regular exposure to poor-quality programming has been linked to:

- Obesity
- Inadequate sleep schedules and insufficient sleep
- Behavior problems
- Delays in language and social skills development
- Violence
- Attention problems
- Less time learning

#### Developing screen time rules

The American Academy of Pediatrics discourages media use, except for video chatting, by children younger than 18 months. If you introduce digital media to children ages 18 to 24 months, make sure it's high quality and avoid solo media use. For children ages 2 to 5, limit screen time to one hour a day of high-quality programming.

To ensure quality screen time:

- Preview programs, games and apps before allowing your child to view or play with them. Organizations such as Common Sense Media has programming ratings and reviews to help you determine what's appropriate for your child's age. Better yet, watch, play or use them with your child.
- Seek out interactive options that engage your child, rather than those that just require pushing and swiping or staring at the screen.
- Use parental controls to block or filter internet content.
- Make sure your child is close by during screen time so that you can supervise his or her activities.
- Ask your child regularly what programs, games and apps he or she has played with during the day.
- When watching programming with your child, discuss what you're watching and educate your child about advertising and commercials.

Also, avoid fast-paced programming, which young children have a hard time understanding, violent content and apps with a lot of distracting content. Eliminate advertising on apps, since young children have trouble telling the difference between ads and factual information.

#### Setting limits for older children

Establish clear rules and set reasonable limits for your child's use of digital media. Consider these tips:

- Encourage unplugged, unstructured playtime.
- Create tech-free zones or times, such as during mealtime or one night a week.
- Discourage use of media entertainment during homework.
- Set and enforce daily or weekly screen time limits and curfews, such as no exposure to devices or screens one hour before bedtime.
- Consider using apps that control the length of time a child can use a device.
- Keep screens out of your child's bedroom and consider requiring your children to charge their devices outside of their bedrooms at night.
- Eliminate background TV.

Finally, set a good example. Consider that your child is watching you for cues on when it's OK to use screens and how to use them.

You'll likely need to continue to guide, manage and monitor your child's use of screens and media as he or she grows. But by developing household rules — and revisiting them as your child grows — you can help ensure a safe experience.
