Finally February!

"The Lord delights in those who fear him, who put their hope in his unfailing love" Psalm 147:11

February is finally here! Why get excited about that? According to meteorological reckoning, winter occurs during those months with the coldest average temperatures, making February the last month of winter. I prefer that reckoning over the astronomical season which doesn't end winter until the spring equinox. That doesn't happen until 10:06 pm on March 19 this year. I like to begin spring early in my mind.

February is a strange month. Somewhere around 713 BC, the Roman King Numa Pompilius added two months, January and February, to their old ten month calendar. To synch up his new calendar to match the lunar year of 355 days, he needed one month out of the twelve to contain an even number of days. So King Numa chose February to be that month, having only 28 days.

There are many fun "national" days in February, and I'm not referring to Valentine's or Groundhog Day. February 2 is National Ukulele Day, and even better, National Tater Tot Day. You don't want to miss National Lame Duck Day on the 6th, or Read in the Bathtub Day on the 9th. This year I vow not to forget to celebrate National Public Sleeping Day on the 28th. But my favorite day of all is National Pizza Day on February 9. (To be honest, I celebrate that day pretty much every Sunday).

But above all we dare not forget that February 14 is Ash Wednesday, beginning our spiritual journey into the season of Lent. This is the first of six Wednesdays set aside to contemplate the passion of our Lord. We remember our helplessness in extricating ourselves from the clutches of sin, death, and the devil, and how God's Son was so filled with love for our lost human race that he rescued us by assuming our guilt on himself and suffering the death we so richly deserved.

If you haven't typically attended our Midweek Lenten Services, be determined to do so this year. And I think you'll find your Easter celebration this time around will be more joyful and meaningful than ever before.

From Your Parish Nurses... Atrial Fibrillation

Atrial fibrillation is a quivering or irregular heart-beat or an arrythmia. Atrial Fibrillation is also known as AFIB or AF. It can lead to blood clots, strokes, heart failure, and other heart related complications. It affects an estimated 2.7 to 6.1 million people in the United States. Over 12 million people are projected to have AFIB by 2030.

Normally your heart contracts and relaxes to a regular beat. In AFIB the upper chambers of the heart beat irregularly. Because enough blood isn't being pumped out of the chambers a blood clot can form which is extremely dangerous. The blood clot can be pumped out of the heart and can cause strokes. About 15-20% of people who have strokes have AFIB. Patients are prescribed blood thinners for clot risk.

Untreated AFIB doubles the risk of heart-related deaths and is associated with a five-fold increased risk for stroke. Many people are unaware that AFIB is a serious condition.

Symptoms include fast irregular heart beat, heart palpitations, feeling light headed or faint, chest pain or pressure, shortness of breath (especially when lying down), and tiring more easily. There is a symptom tracker on the American Heart Association website.

Treatment will depend on the underlying causes of AFIB and level of disability. It can be treated with certain medications. A cardiologist and/or electrophysiologist will participate in the patient's care. Working with one's whole medical team will provide a good outcome. Other treatments include ablation and pacemakers. Sometimes AFIB goes away, but in some patients it is ongoing.

Lifestyle changes can also help. Heart-healthy living involves understanding your risk, making healthy choices, and taking steps to reduce your chances of getting heart disease. Some risks are high blood pressure, being overweight or obese, diabetes, smoking, not exercising, and more.

Any questions regarding Atrial Fibrillation should be addressed by your medical team.
