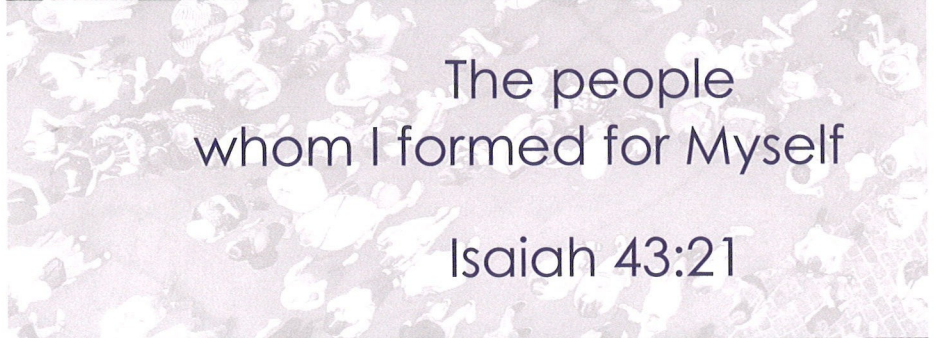

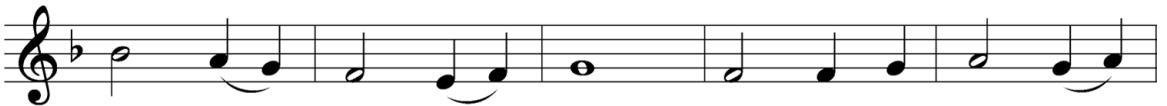

CONFESSION OF SINS AND FORGIVENESS

P: So often we have despised God's Word and failed to gladly hear and learn it. For this and all our sins, we bow before God and humbly ask for his forgiveness.

C: Holy and merciful Father, I confess that I am by nature sinful and that I have disobeyed you in my thoughts, words, and actions. I have done what is evil and failed to do what is good. For this I deserve your punishment both now and in eternity. But I am truly sorry for my sins, and trusting in my Savior Jesus Christ, I pray: Lord, have mercy on me, a sinner.

P: God gave his Word so "that you may believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God, and that by believing you may have life in his name." (John 20:31) The Scriptures testify about Jesus, who lived a perfect life for you, died on the cross to pay for all your sins, and rose again to assure you of your salvation. Therefore, as a called servant of Christ and by his authority, I forgive you all your sins in the name of the Father and of the Son (†) and of the Holy Spirit.

C: Amen.

PRAYER

P: Eternal God and Father, we thank you for sending your only Son, who was betrayed, given into the hands of wicked men, and made to suffer and die on the cross for our salvation. Strengthen our faith in him, and lead us to follow Jesus, our only Savior, in his living, dying, and rising from the dead. In his name we pray.

C: Amen.

RESPONSIVE PASSION READING

Leader: “Which of the two do you want me to release to you?”

Women: With one voice they cried out to the governor:

Men: “Away with this man! Release Barabbas to us!”

Women: Barabbas had been thrown into prison for an insurrection in the city, and for murder. Wanting to release Jesus, Pilate appealed to them again. But they kept shouting,

Men: “Crucify him! Crucify him!”

Women: For the third time he spoke to them:

Leader: “Why? What crime has this man committed? I have found in him no grounds for the death penalty. Therefore, I will have him punished and then release him.”

Women: But the Jews kept shouting,

Men: “If you let this man go, you are no friend of Caesar. Anyone who claims to be a king opposes Caesar.”

Women: When Pilate heard this, he brought Jesus out and sat down on the judge’s seat at a place known as the Stone Pavement. It was the day of Preparation of Passover Week, about the sixth hour. Pilate said to the Jews:

Leader: “Here is your king.”

Men: “Take him away! Take him away! Crucify him!”

Leader: “Shall I crucify your king?”

Men: “We have no king but Caesar.”

Women: When Pilate saw that he was getting nowhere, but that instead an uproar was starting, he took water and washed his hands in front of the crowd. He said:

Leader: “I am innocent of this man’s blood. It is your responsibility!”

Men: “Let his blood be on us and on our children!”

Women: Then he released Barabbas to them. But he had Jesus flogged, and handed him over to be crucified.

Leader: The soldiers led Jesus away into the palace (that is, the Praetorium) and called together the whole company of soldiers. And when they had mocked him, they took off the purple robe and put his own clothes on him. Then they led him out to crucify him. As they led him away, they seized Simon from Cyrene, who was on his way in from the country, and put the cross on him and made him carry it behind Jesus. A large number of people followed him, including women who mourned and wailed for him. Jesus turned and said to them:

Men: “Daughters of Jerusalem, do not weep for me; weep for yourselves and for your children. For the time will come when you will say,

Women: ‘Blessed are the barren women, the wombs that never bore and the breasts that never nursed!’

Men: “Then, they will say to the mountains: ‘Fall on us!’ and to the hills: ‘Cover us!’ For if men do these things when the tree is green, what will happen when it is dry?”

Leader: Two other men, both criminals, were also led out with him to be executed. They came to a place called Golgatha (which means The Place of the Skull). There they offered Jesus wine to drink, mixed with gall; but after tasting it, he refused to drink it. There they crucified him, along with the criminals — one on his right, the other on his left. Jesus said,

Men: “Father, forgive them, for they do not know what they are doing.”

Leader: Pilate had a notice prepared and fastened to the cross. It read, JESUS OF NAZARETH, THE KING OF THE JEWS. Many of the Jews read this sign, for the place where Jesus was crucified was near the city, and the sign was written in Aramaic, Latin and Greek. The chief priests of the Jews protested to Pilate:

Men: “Do not write, ‘The King of the Jews,’ but that this man claimed to be king of the Jews.”

Women: Pilate answered:

Leader: “What I have written, I have written.”

SERMON TEXT *Luke 20: 9-20*

He went on to tell the people this parable: “A man planted a vineyard, rented it to some farmers and went away for a long time. At harvest time he sent a servant to the tenants so they would give him some of the fruit of the vineyard. But the tenants beat him and sent him away empty-handed. He sent another servant, but that one also they beat and treated shamefully and sent away empty-handed. He sent still a third, and they wounded him and threw him out.

“Then the owner of the vineyard said, ‘What shall I do? I will send my son, whom I love; perhaps they will respect him.’

“But when the tenants saw him, they talked the matter over. ‘This is the heir,’ they said. ‘Let’s kill him, and the inheritance will be ours.’ So they threw him out of the vineyard and killed him.

“What then will the owner of the vineyard do to them? He will come and kill those tenants and give the vineyard to others.”

When the people heard this, they said, “God forbid!”

Jesus looked directly at them and asked, “Then what is the meaning of that which is written:

“‘The stone the builders rejected
has become the cornerstone’?

Everyone who falls on that stone will be broken to pieces; anyone on whom it falls will be crushed.”

The teachers of the law and the chief priests looked for a way to arrest him immediately, because they knew he had spoken this parable against them. But they were afraid of the people.

Keeping a close watch on him, they sent spies, who pretended to be sincere. They hoped to catch Jesus in something he said, so that they might hand him over to the power and authority of the governor.

P: Dear members of the congregation, I also ask you: Do you heartily accept these new members as your brothers and sisters in Christ?

C: Yes, we welcome you into our midst, promising to show you Christian fellowship and love, and by word and example, with God's help, to encourage you in your Christian faith, as we ask you to do with us.

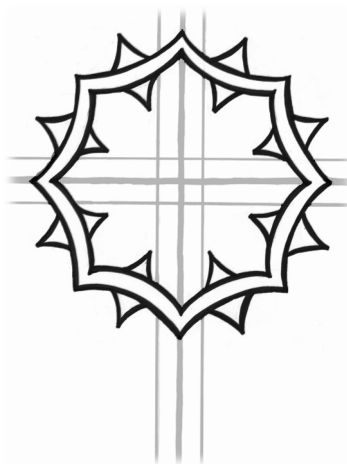
Thank You to Jenny Lindee for serving as our pianist in our Saturday evening service.



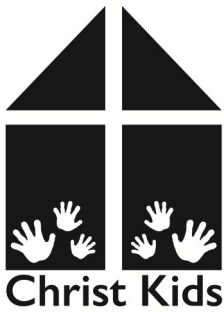
